### Textbooks and Stationery for 2018

As informed at the recent P & C meeting in 2018, textbooks for all grades will be again available for purchase through the Flexischools website. Once this is available, we will inform parents so you can attend to this at your convenience. For those parents without internet access, there will be a phone number available for parents to call. Textbooks will be delivered to school at the beginning of the school year.

Students in Years 2-6 will receive a stationery list from their class teacher for parents to source independently. We will bulk order stationery items from Humphreys for students in Kindergarten and Year One. These items will be delivered to Kindergarten and Year One classrooms in bulk and billed to the Semester One School Account.

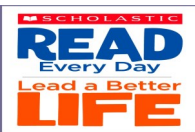

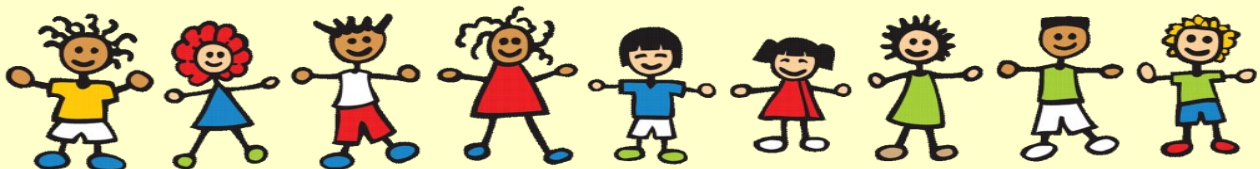
## 'BounceBack' Program

**What can you do to help your child if they are bullied and to encourage them not to bully others?**

Respond calmly if you think your child is being bullied. Talk to them about what is happening. Listen to the whole story before responding or asking questions. Ask how they would like you to help. One of their fears will be that you might over-react and make things worse.

Discuss with them what they could do, e.g:

- ♦ avoid high-risk areas and not respond to nasty text messages etc.
- ♦ Say 'leave me alone' in a calm voice and leave the situation (rather than yelling or responding in an upset or emotional way)
  - ♦ Talk to their friends about what's happening and ask for help
  - ♦ Speak to a teacher and ask for support to solve the problem.

This week in the Kitchen Garden...

Have you been down to the garden recently? Partly due to the scraps that each class collects from fruit break, Year 4 has been making fantastic compost and the garden is growing well. There are capsicum, eggplant, figs, corn, cucumbers, olives, zucchini, silverbeet, lettuce and loads of herbs!! These last two weeks, Year 4 has been doing art work for the garden and painting signs. We've also harvested the potatoes, and next week we'll be tasting fried potatoes!

Year 2 students are coming back to the garden next week to harvest their climbing beans which are growing well and to check on their sunflowers that are just starting to flower. Some of them are now almost 2 metres tall! We'll also be learning about the water cycle.

With the help of some wonderful mums and one grandmother, Kindy planted the flowers and herbs into the pots and gumboots in the K-2 Literacy & Numeracy Area last week. They have been doing a wonderful job looking after them and soon that area will be full of colour and scent. We can always add more so if you have old kid-sized gumboots, just drop them off at the shed. Thanks also to my mum who sewed all the flags together to make the colourful bunting.

# Manly West Before & After School Care

Dear Parents and Caregivers

We are very proud of the service we provide at Manly West BASC and we hope your children have enjoyed their time with us this year. Our program aims to provide fun and challenging activities including art, sport, music, science, craft, games, drama, cooking and technology. Children have also had opportunities to participate in externally provided incursion activities such as Bootcamp, making Billy carts, 3D printing and coding, cartooning workshops and orienteering.

For the last 4 years, we have been able to provide high quality care **without increasing our fees**, however, to meet costs, an increase in session fees is necessary in 2018. Even after these increases, it is worth noting that Manly West BASC is still cheaper than many similar services in the area.

In 2018: BSC sessions (2hrs) will increase by 0.50c to **\$12.00**

ASC sessions (3hrs) will increase 90c to **\$19.40**
