Ethics

Special Ethics Education (SEE) **may** be an option for students who attend Non-Scripture. This is dependent on available volunteer teachers from our school community. At this stage we are able to offer Ethics to students in Years 2-6. If Ethics becomes available for Year 1 and Kindergarten students, we will send home a note to parents of students attending Non-Scripture.

If you are interested in your child attending Ethics, please consider volunteering to teach Ethics. This year we welcomed new Ethics Coordinator and Manly West parent, Lisa Palmer. Please see the note below about volunteering to be an Ethics teacher.

We Need More Volunteer Teachers of Ethics

The Ethics program offers children an opportunity to engage in extraordinary conversation and being a Volunteer in the Ethics program is incredibly rewarding.

No teaching experience is necessary for this position as the role is more about facilitating discussion. Detailed, age-appropriate lesson plans are provided by Primary Ethics.

Many parents have indicated that they would like their child to attend Ethics classes, however, we do not have enough volunteers to offer classes to all interested students.

Becoming a volunteer Ethics teacher is simple:

- ☐ contact Lisa Palmer to find out more, show you how to apply and arrange an interview.
- ☐ obtain a police check and complete various paperwork
- ☐ attend a 2 day training course through Primary Ethics (www.primaryethics.com.au)
- ☐ teach a 30 minute class each Thursday morning.

Kitchen Garden

Our 'Blues' inspired Rugby League boys will take to the field on Friday 8th June for an action packed day. Their preparation for the event should serve them well.

BounceBack' Program

Throughout Terms 2 and 3 the Bounce Back program will continue to be taught in classrooms. A parent booklet outlining information about this program is available outside the office where extra notes are located. Students will learn about bullying. Lessons will focus on the definition of bullying and understanding what it is, what to do if you are bullied and what to do if you witness bullying. The Looking on the Bright Side lessons focus on optimistic thinking which links into the students and teachers work on positive mindset.

What is Bullying?

Most children occasionally get teased or annoyed by other children at school. Responding to this is one of the common challenges that children have to face at school. Being bullied is more serious. Bullying is when one child (or a group) repeatedly and deliberately uses negative words and/or hostile actions against one specific child that causes distress. Bullying can be:

- Physical (e.g. hitting, pushing or damaging personal property)
- Verbal (e.g. insults or nasty name-calling)
- Social (e.g. trying to socially isolate someone by spreading lies or rumours about them or stopping them from joining in)
- Cyberbullying: this means using technology (such as email, mobile phones or social networking sites) to bully someone verbally or socially or to frighten or intimidate them.

It isn't called bullying if any of these things happen only once, if children have a mutual argument or fight, or if a child chooses not to spend time with another child.

Over the next couple of weeks we will provide tips on talking to your child.

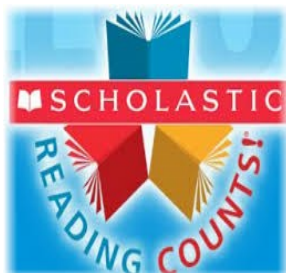

INACTIVE POSITIONS ON THE WAITING LIST

Manly West BASC has a continued commitment to the school community to provide high quality care to as many families as possible. Due to space limitations and regulation requirements we are currently unable to increase the number of places we provide. To better utilise the existing places and minimise frustration with the lengthy waiting list, an 'Inactive' option will be offered to families.

* To encourage families to release a permanent place that is not currently utilised but is required in the future (eg. End of sporting season, maternity leave) an option to become 'Inactive' on the waiting list will be made available. This will enable the relinquished place to be offered to the next child on the waiting list.

* Families who nominate to become Inactive will be placed at the top of the waiting list until they request to become Active again.

* When BASC is notified by a parent that they wish to become Active again, the next available place for that session will be offered.

* The next available place offered means the place may not be immediately available when requested. The waiting list remains fluid and places are reallocated as soon as possible.

* Sessions made Inactive must remain so for a **minimum period of six weeks**.

* The date a session is made Inactive will be recorded on the waiting list.

* Inactive sessions will be 'shaded' on the waiting list and no places offered until BASC is notified by a parent that they wish to become Active again.

* When a place is offered from the waiting list and declined, parents will be asked if they want to become Inactive or choose to come off the waiting list.

* New sessions added to the waiting list will still be added by the date the request was made.

* Priority of Access Guidelines and Session Allocation Guidelines still apply. (See Priority of Access policy and Session Allocation Policy)

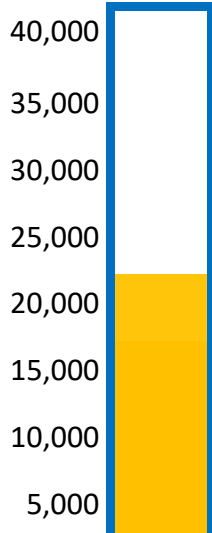

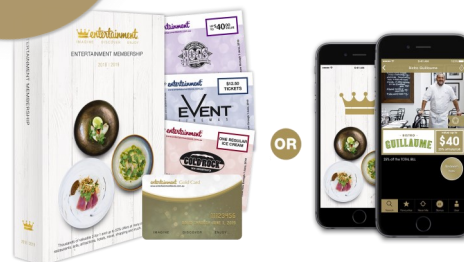
