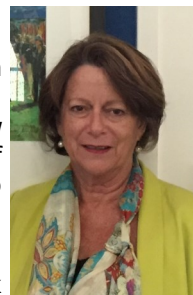

Bounce Back Program- Looking on the bright side

Some key messages to communicate to your child about being optimistic.

Good memories of things help you to bounce back.

When you are feeling sad because you have lost someone or something you love, it helps to remember some of the good times you shared with them to help you feel a bit better.

When one unhappy thing happens in your life it doesn't spoil everything else.

When one thing in your life goes wrong or you feel unhappy or worried, try to remember all the things that are still good in your life. It's just one thing that is going wrong for a while, not everything.

What can you do to help your child look on the bright side?

Modelling

Let your child see and hear you using positive tracking, showing gratitude, saying 'things will get better soon' and expecting that good outcomes are possible.

Intention to apply for Year 7 entry to a selective high school in 2020

Selective high schools cater for high achieving academically gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level.

Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on **Thursday 14th March 2019**.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2020, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be available from mid-September 2018 at

The application website opens at that link on **9th October 2018** and closes on **12th November 2018**.

You must apply before the closing date.

There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the High Performance Unit for assistance after the 9th October 2018.

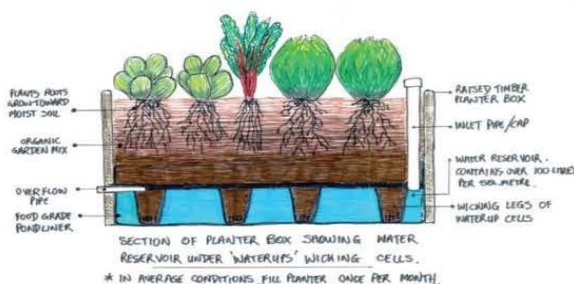

The sustainable garden bed is watered from below ground by using WaterUps Wicking Cells. You can't see them but they are the new technology in eco-friendly gardening.

WaterUps saves up to 90% of the water normally used in your garden bed and you only need to fill up your WaterUps bed with water once per month on average.

This week in the Kitchen Garden...

It's a busy time of the year in the Kitchen Garden!

Year 4 in the Kitchen Garden

Jobs this week include preparing the soil for spring planting next term. As the weather warms up we'll be distributing mulch on the garden beds to keep the soil cool and moist. We will also be harvesting from our bumper Broad Bean Crop!

We are also finishing making their beeswax wraps. These should be used at home or at school instead of single use plastic like cling film.

If you haven't already, could you please send in a clean glass jar (the shape of a salsa jar is perfect) for the terrariums.

War on Waste

If you haven't seen the latest episodes, catch up on ABC iView over the holidays.

Did you know that there is a reverse vending machine in the carpark of Coles at Manly Vale and in the underground carpark at Woolworths Balgowlah? Please encourage your children to bring their recyclable drink containers (like juice or milk cartons) home so they can be recycled. Each empty and uncrushed glass or plastic bottle or aluminium can can be redeemed for 10c.

Year 2 in the Kitchen Garden

Year 2 have been back for a lesson in the garden observing change and feeding their sunflower seedlings that have just germinated!

Year 1 in the Kitchen Garden

1T and 1E have been visiting the Bush Tucker Garden and learning about the varied uses of native plants.

5J in the Kitchen Garden

5J have been back this week to clear out the wicking bed and replenish the soil, adding compost and cow manure, in readiness for spring planting. We discussed why failed crops are part of gardening and we've been problem solving to try to figure out what we can do differently this time.

We need help watering the garden and turning the compost over the holidays and into Term 4. Everyone who is bringing kitchen scraps from home to put into the school compost bins are asked to sign themselves up at least once per term to help. 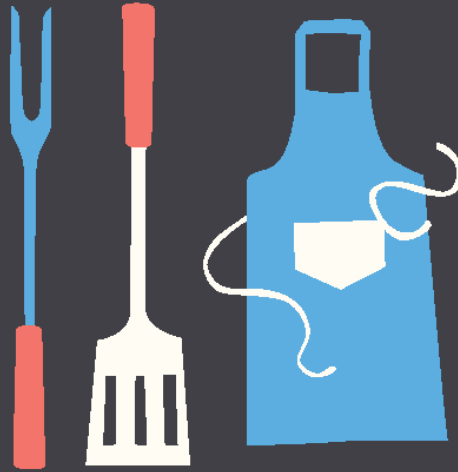

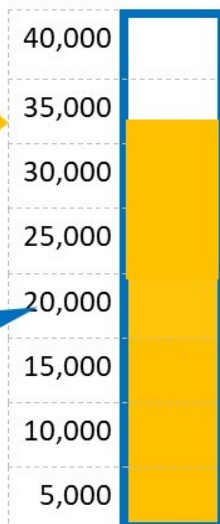
