### 2019

Year 1-6 students resume Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> January. New students to Manly West in Years 1-6 arrive at 10am on Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> January. Kindergarten students attend their transition morning on Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> January and also attend their Best Start appointments that week. All Year 1-6 students should assemble on their 2018 grade lines. Students will be participating in rotations of healthy lifestyle lessons during the first week. Children will move into their 2019 classes the following week.

### Security/ COLA and Painting

Please call the security number on the notice board for any problems in the school during the holidays. The hall will be used in the holidays for 2 weeks by a company called Kids Up Front. They need to access the hall and stay away from any building works on site.

The Kindergarten and Year 1 block will be painted in the holidays over Christmas and New Year. The COLA foundations have now set and work will begin on the COLA as soon as possible in the holidays. There will be access disruptions for the Markets during the holidays.

### Reminder: Students have strong capabilities and resilience!

We received a number of parent requests for 2019 classes in the last 4 weeks. Many of the requests were quite untenable and do not give equity to all students.

One of the teacher professional standards is to know your students and how they learn. Transition information of each student is transferred to classroom teachers at the beginning of each year or time of change. Classroom teachers working with each child in the class gradually understand the different needs of our students and spend a significant number of hours organising the classes.

We also discuss resilience and independence with our students and they are wonderful ambassadors of these attributes. There are some very serious reasons why we place

some students in particular classes or separate students but otherwise our students should have the capabilities to successfully experience new classes, grades and teachers in preparation for their future.

These classes have already been completed and further adjustments will only be made when new students arrive at the beginning of the year.

# **BASC TO EXPAND IN 2019!**

Thank you to everyone who attended the meeting on Monday night to discuss the changes to BASC in 2019.

The BASC Committee presented the proposed plans, shared a number of photographs, spoke about staffing these new facilities, the programs that will be run and the impact on waitlists.

More than 50 people attended the meeting and the vote was unanimous to support the use of the current STEM demountable and two new demountables on the northern side of the Hall to provide additional before and after school care places.

The current STEM building will be available during Term 1, 2019 and will increase BASC capacity by 20 students for each morning and afternoon session.

The new demountables will be fully operative by the end of Term 2 and will further increase BASC capacity by 40 students for each morning and afternoon session.

### These combined changes will increase BASC capacity from 150 to 210 per session which equates to an additional 600 spots per week. This is an overall increase in places of 40%.

On behalf of the P&C, I would like to thank Tony Falzarano, Sarah Falzarano, Guy Holley, Sarah Peters and Anne Quattroville for their commitment over the past few weeks to reach such an amazing outcome in such a short period of time. I'd also like to thank the BASC Committee, the P&C Executive, Julie Organ, MWPS Principal and key Department of Education and Asset Management staff for their support with this project.

The BASC Committee, along with the P&C Executive thank you for your support and request your patience as we install, fit-out and staff these new facilities to bring you the new and expanded BASC in 2019. Please check the BASC section of the newsletter for updates on the key progress reports.

The P&C Executive would also like to thank you for your feedback on the BASC waitlists and the high demand for places. Your interest has helped us provide a much needed solution to support our school community. We will review the impact the expansion has had on waitlists mid-year and will look at ways we can further support the needs of our school community.

We look forward to continuing to provide quality before and after school care services for the students of Manly West.

The funds raised are returned to the school to provide upgrades that benefit all students. This year, the **P&C Contributed \$150,000** towards the funding of the new COLA—the majority of the funds were sourced from P&C Fundraising over a number of years and \$20,000 from successful grant applications submitted to the NSW Community Building Partnership 2017 programme. The P&C also contributed to **\$80,000** towards the new outdoor learning amphitheatre area adjacent to the Year 3-4 BASC and Year 4 classrooms.

The **Sports in Schools** program raised an incredible \$6400 worth of sporting equipment all from our supportive parents who shopped at Coles during the promotion.

The **P&C Contributions** listed on the student term fees account will be used to improve library, maths and literacy resources for the students of Manly West.

The P&C has a number of exciting events planned for 2019, including the highly anticipated **MW CARNIVAL.** Please keep your eye on the newsletter for all the upcoming news.
