Count Us In Music

Next Thursday at 12.30pm, K-6 students will be involved in the Australia-wide Count Us In Music event. The students are currently learning the song in preparation.

Cyber Safety Session-Year 5 and 6 Students and Parents.

Dr Kristy Goodwin presented two workshops last Monday to Year 5 and 6 students and presented a parent workshop in the evening. Dr Kristy Goodwin is one of Australia's leading digital wellness and digital parenting educators. She is the author of *Raising Your Child in a Digital World*, a speaker and a digital wellness researcher.

She offered some very important messages to parents including recommending that parents should be in charge of technology in the household and that devices should be avoided in the bedroom. She also presented scientific research about the reasons why technology can easily distract and appeal. She discussed the brain development and responses to modern technology and stressed the significance of sleep for children and adults. Thank you to the P&C, particularly Melina Rohan and Tracey Martin for their partnership with the school with this initiative.

On Tuesday, Lance Balchin, the author of 'Mechanica' visited and presented workshops with Manly West students and teachers in Years 5 and 6. The NSW Arts Unit filmed his presentation and the workshops to promote and inspire other teachers and schools. Kindergarten Orientation for 2019 Students

There are **two Kindergarten Orientation Days** for students:

Orientation One is on **Wednesday 7th November from 9:45 - 11:00am**.

Orientation Two is on **Tuesday 13th November from 9:45 - 11:00am**.

Students attend both orientation mornings. Once parents have taken their child to their designated orientation classroom, we ask that parents join us in the hall for morning tea, a brief presentation and Q & A time during the first orientation. Helping Your Child Experience Success

Teaching your child how to set goals and achieve them by making a plan, working hard, solving problems and not giving up helps them to build life skills that are important for their future. These life skills build their self-confidence and motivation and the ability to persist when they find things difficult. An important starting point is to help your child identify their particular character strengths and ability strengths.

Character strengths are personal attributes like being brave or kind, or being a hard worker or a good organiser. Ability strengths are things that they do well such as writing stories, drawing cartoons, playing sport, playing a musical instrument or understanding and working with animals.

At school we use Visible Learning to assist this by using Learning Intentions and Success Criteria, so that students are more connected with their learning and able to learn to self-assess and set goals for their learning. We emphasise the key messages that we are all learning and that learning is ongoing and requires practice.

Key Messages to communicate to your child about being successful

Stick with it and don't give up.

When something proves hard to do, stick to your plan and don't give up. If an obstacle gets in the way, see it as a problem that needs to be solved. Sometimes you may have to try a new way to solve the problem.

Mistakes help you to learn.

Everybody makes mistakes when they are trying to achieve their goals. Try to learn from mistakes that you make even if you don't feel too happy when you make them.

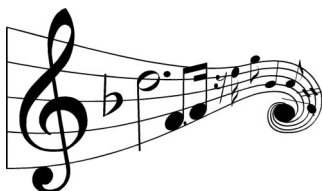
BLOW TESTS – YEAR 2 AND ANYONE INTERESTED IN JOINING BAND

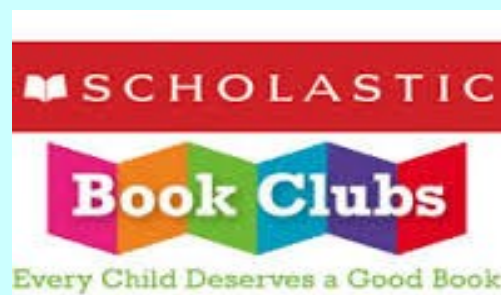
Library News

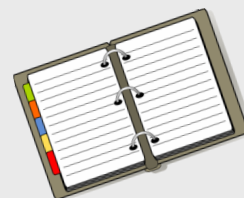

Children or families referred to us from an outside agency, School Principal, School Counsellor etc will also be considered by the Nominated Supervisor for priority placement. Due to the limited child care places available please be aware that families with a higher priority will take precedence on waiting lists and allocation of places. The Centre must be informed immediately of any change to Priority of Access Information.

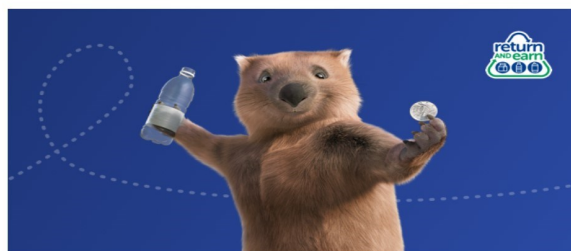
