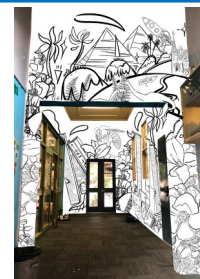

## Assessment and Reporting to Parents

Student progress is assessed continuously throughout the school year through a range of strategies which include teacher observation, checklists, tests, peer assessments, self-assessments, projects, practical work samples and performance items.

Written reports are provided towards the conclusion of Terms 2 and 4. **Tomorrow you will receive your child's Semester One report.**

A scale is used to judge student effort;

Outstanding, High, Sound, Inconsistent and Limited.

Effort is highly valued by the school and is reflected in our School Expectation to ASPIRE. We encourage you to celebrate your child's learning by making time to discuss the progress report with your child and congratulate their efforts. We aim to develop lifelong learners who reflect on their progress and develop a positive growth mindset.

Teachers have assessed each student's achievement compared with the expectations described in each Key Learning Area (KLA) syllabus. Kindergarten students' progress will be reported through a checklist of skills in Literacy and Numeracy.

In Years 1-6, judgements are made on a 5 point achievement scale, using the word descriptors;

Outstanding, High, Sound, Basic and Limited.

### Outstanding

The student has an **extensive knowledge and understanding** of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a **very high level of competence** in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.

### High

The student has a **thorough knowledge and understanding** of the content and a **high level of competence** in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and the skills to most situations.

### Sound

The student has a **sound knowledge and understanding** of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.

### Basic

The student has a **basic knowledge and understanding** of the content and has achieved a limited level of competence in the processes and skills.

### Limited

The student has an **elementary knowledge and understanding** in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.

Please also note:

- there is no pass, fail or bell curve and there is no set number or spread of grades a teacher or school can allocate.
- a student who receives 'sound' is 'on track' and is achieving grade outcomes.
- an 'achieved' rank on a Kindergarten report relating to Literacy and Numeracy checklist items, equates to a 'sound' on a Year 1 - 6 report.
- reports reflect a snap shot in time. Direct comparisons to a previous year are not encouraged - students may find aspects of learning more challenging as the content and tasks become more difficult. This does not equate to lack of progress but moving through a new stage of learning that may require a different set of skills or timeframe to reach competence.

### Aboriginal Performance: TAPALINGA with Majeda Beatty

This Thursday, Majeda Beatty will be at Manly West to perform for K-2 and Years 3, 5 & 6. Majeda is a Sydney-based singer, actor and dancer who comes from a proud Wuthathi mother, her roots stemming from Far North Queensland, and an African American father. Growing up, she was taught the importance of her culture from her mother through movement, song and storytelling. The richness of both Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island cultures will be shared in this two part, immersive performance which is tailored to the age groups of the audience through song, dance, stories and language, all with high levels of participation. The flags will be discussed and Majeda will present and demonstrate various instruments, artifacts and costumes specific to each culture as well as the importance of ochre and the significance of the body paint designs in Aboriginal culture. She will perform and teach dances for audience participation.

### Dance Expos Stage 1 and Stage 3

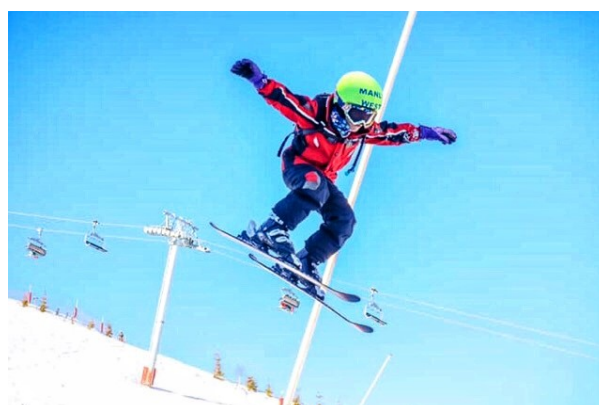

**STEAM Room – Favourites Week!** Activities including photobooth craft, paper weaving placements, Lego Masters competition, music games and breakfasts of rainbow pikelets and croissants!

The STEAM Room activity is generally offered to all ages with groups up to 30 children per session.

Reports from our Room Leaders about some of the activities they have planned this week. Note, activities at BASC are based on the likes and interests of the children that attend and are linked to **My Time, Our Place Outcomes**.

- Lauren: This week in K-2 room we'll be drawing what the children did on the weekend and what they want to be when they grow up, having a colouring comp, stencils and family portraits. Outdoors we'll be playing Survivor, Fumbles, Kick Ball, Cricket, Soccer drills and rotation games.
- Ben: Junior detectives needed this week in Years 3 & 4 Room. A variety of code breaking and clue solving puzzle activities occurring this week requiring keen problem solving and deductive reasoning skills. For the sportier members, we will be keeping warm with some old school group games, such as Kick Tennis and Bin Ball, to build on our team-work and communication both with peers and with staff.
- Aidan 5/6: To get the kids co-operating with each other as well as testing their co-ordination and problem solving skills. Outside we will have an obstacle course to be completed while blind, different parachute challenges as well as soccer. Inside we will be making different designs of Hama Beads and creating artworks based around our own fingerprints. Our transition games this week will be centred around problem solving in games of Mastermind and Make a Word.

You can look at the full list of programmed activities and our menus displayed in each room! Please note we offer time and assistance to do homework every day except when an incursion is programmed or for children in the STEAM room. We encourage homework but do not enforce.

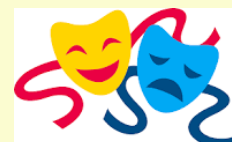
