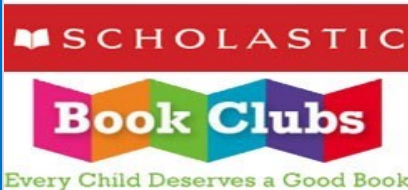
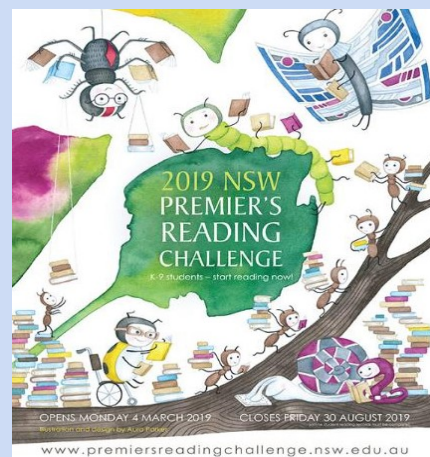

Majeda Beatty—Tapalinga

On Thursday 27th of June, Manly West Public School went to an AMAZING incursion. We saw the actor, dancer and singer Majeda Beatty perform her show Tapalinga in our school hall.

First she taught us some BRILLIANT Aboriginal dances from the Torres Strait. Majeda got the year 2s to go up and do a sitting down dance. She also taught us that crossing your legs means bubook.

Next she told Manly West about what the colours on the Torres Strait flag meant. Green represents land, blue represents the ocean, white represents one of the head dresses they wear to their dances (Dhari) and black represents Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders.

After that Majeda taught us a dance called Taba-Naba which got taught to the Wiggles to make Non-Indigenous people want to know about their culture. It was written by Christina Anu.

She then taught us about the Aboriginal flag. Black represents the Aboriginal people, yellow represents the sun and red represents the land.

We found out about the instruments both the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders used. The drums were made out of delicious bamboo, and the shakers were made out of coconut seeds.

Soon after some of the Year 3s got to get a little face paint.

Overall I had an EXCELLENT day and hope to have days like this again.

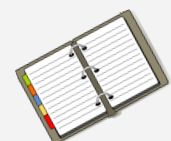

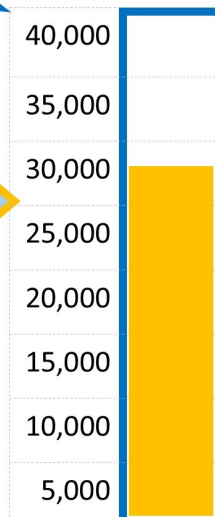
