Dear Resident or Business Owner ,

Raised Pedestrian Crossing – Balgowlah Road, Balgowlah Council has received concerns from local residents regarding safety for pedestrians using the existing pedestrian crossing on Balgowlah Road at Boyle Street. Residents advise that cars frequently travel too fast past the crossing and that some do not stop for pedestrians with near misses frequently occurring. As the crossing is located close to Manly West Public School it is used frequently by school children.

Council has undertaken a review of the above location and proposes to reconstruct the crossing as a raised pedestrian crossing. This will make it more conspicuous and assist in keeping the speed of vehicles down as they pass over the crossing.

A concept plan is enclosed with this letter for your information.

Council invites you to submit your comments on this proposal. Please respond with Support or Non-Support followed by any additional comments by 6 November 2020.

Your comments will only be considered if they include your name and address. Please note that individual responses will not be provided.

Written submissions can be posted to PO Box 82, Manly NSW 1655, or alternatively you may email your comments to Council@northernbeaches.nsw.gov.au.

Once feedback has been reviewed the matter may then be raised for consideration at the Northern Beaches Council Local Traffic Committee. The Traffic Committee's decision will be available on Council's website one week after the meeting.
