Year 7 High Potential & Gifted Education Academic Placement Test 2022 Intake

Placement in the Year 7 High Potential & Gifted Education classes at NBSC Balgowlah Boys, NBSC Cromer and NBSC Mackellar Girls Campuses is subject to the child's eligibility to attend the school, submission of an application form and based on supporting evidence including the results achieved in the NBSC Academic Placement Test. The closing date for applications is Friday 19th February at 4pm. Please see the flyer on Page 9 if you would like your child to apply for the Academic Placement Test.

Scripture

Scripture classes will begin on Thursday 4th March.

Scripture options at Manly West include Bahai, Catholic, Protestant or Non-Scripture. The NSW Department of Education does not allow us to teach students during the allocated 30 minute Scripture time. Students who opt out of Special Religious Education (SRE), otherwise known as Scripture, will read or complete a quiet, independent activity supervised by staff.

Special Ethics Education (SEE) may be an option for students who attend Non-Scripture. This is dependent on available volunteer teachers from our school community. Priority to Ethics is given to children of Ethics volunteers, followed by students who have previously attended Ethics and those students who were on the Ethics waiting list last year.

We are sometimes asked whether students can change Scripture groups each term. Students are placed in a class for the year. It is not an option to experience different Scripture groups in a school year, however, parents can choose a different group the following year. Thank you for your understanding.

Scripture Students in Years 1 - 6 will be placed in the same Scripture faith attended last year.

School Expectations/Student Welfare Policy

Students throughout the school are establishing class routines and rules in line with our School Expectations of **Respect, Responsibility and Aspire**.

Each week, teachers present three Expectation Cards in class to acknowledge individual students for demonstrating these expectations. When a student in Years 3-6 has **collected four Expectation Cards** they place them in the labelled boxes opposite the entrance to the DP Office near the staffroom. K-2 students place the Expectation Cards on my office desk, situated on the bottom floor of the Kindergarten and Year 1 block.

During assemblies teachers award two merit certificates per class to acknowledge individual student progress, attainment and/or effort. In turn, all children will have their moment to shine. We ask that you assist your child to keep certificates safe at home. Our award system will be explained at the Parent/Caregiver Information Evenings.

Kindergarten Transition to School

We thank Kindergarten parents for their support of the transition program and for their preparation of their child for school. From tomorrow, Thursday 4th February, Kindergarten students are starting school on the regular school bell at 9.20am and finishing at 2.30pm until Friday 12th February. Thank you for indicating if your child is staying at school until 3.20pm. If your arrangements change, please email the school with attention to your child's class teacher. Each Kindergarten teacher has a poster outside their classroom for parents to complete for this purpose (check). Students who remain at school after 2.30pm will be collected from Kindergarten Yellow and Kindergarten Orange classrooms - attached to the Kindergarten balcony. From Monday 15th February, all Kindergarten students will be dismissed at 3.20pm.

Thank you to our Prefects, our Kindergarten staff and the many staff who support Kindergarten.

Textbooks and Stationery for 2021

Textbooks are available through Humphreys, Balgowlah Road. We ask that you present at the store and indicate your child's school and grade for 2021. Most grades have one or two assigned textbooks. Year 5 parents, please note there are no Year 5 textbooks to purchase this year.

Stationery lists were sent home at the end of last year and are available on our school website under the School Notes tab. We ask parents to source these items independently. All items are available at our local Humphreys store in Balgowlah Road, near our school.

Medical Needs

Please ensure the school is aware of any medical needs your child may have. It is the responsibility of parents to provide updated health plans, action plans and medicine to the school and this is tied to your child's enrolment. Please note, Anaphylaxis Action Plans need to be in colour, on the most recent form provided by ASCIA (currently 2020), dated 2020/2021 by a doctor and include a colour photo of your child. Thank you to parents who have already visited the office with an updated Health Plan and Action Plan this year. Please also ensure that your child's medication is current.

If you have not yet visited the office to provide your child's health care plan, action plan and check that their medication is current, please do so as soon as possible.

Please also note, should you wish school staff to administer medication at school you are required to complete the following form.


