#### Reading

As part of our Strategic 2021-2024 Improvement Plan, we will be focusing on increasing the reading skills of our students K-6. The teachers are focusing on specific reading initiatives that will assist our students to increase their attainment and growth in these areas across the grades.

For Reading in Kindergarten, teachers are using the Five Aspects of Literacy which include phonics, phonemic awareness, vocabulary, fluency and comprehension in order to help students grow into confident and fluent readers.

In Years 1 and 2, teachers are now focusing on a new Literacy approach embedding encoding and decoding which is explicitly taught through rich texts, high-impact teaching and assessment.

In Years 3-6, teachers are using the Focus on Reading Super Six strategies to support our students with their comprehension. These include making connections, predicting, questioning, monitoring, visualising and summarising.

The Learning Support Team draws upon relevant and reliable data to make evidence-informed decisions and interventions about teaching and learning for supporting students with reading and has also commenced a more reliable way of targeting high potential students as well.

From Monday 10th March, students in Years 4-6 will be dismissed independently at 3.20pm. Year 1 and 2 students will continue to be picked up at 3.15pm.

#### K-6 Semester Accounts

Next week the term accounts will be sent home. The following online programs may be listed on your account and can be accessed at school and from home:

Access to these online programs is via computer, tablet or phone.

#### Mathletics (all students)

Students log-in to access practice and fluency activities, challenge their thinking with problemsolving and reasoning questions, and reward their learning with certificates and points.



#### Soundwaves (Years 1-6)

In lieu of the traditional Look, Cover, Write Check method of reviewing spelling words at home, students can access Soundwaves online. Students in Years 1-6 progress their spelling through a systematic synthetic phonics and word-study program designed to develop reading, spelling and writing skills.



#### Wushka (K-2 students)

Wushka is an online library that gives students access to thousands of home readers both levelled and decodable, and includes comprehension questions. This enables us to supplement and support our school home readers.



#### Typing (Years K-6)

This typing tuition course teaches skills for life and can be used on any device. Focus is on ten finger typing skills and mastery through game play.

Students are encouraged to bring gardening gloves or tongs to collect rubbish around the school.



#### Kitchen Garden News


#### In the Kitchen Garden this week...

#### Library News

The **2021 NSW Premier's Reading Challenge** has opened! The PRC aims to encourage a love of reading for leisure and pleasure in students, and to enable them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition but a challenge to each student to read and to read more widely. We have been asked to delay signing in until further notice, but that should not stop anyone from *READING*!

Here is a short explanation of the PRC and how it is run at Manly West:

- K 2 students can be read to or read independently 30 books from the official PRC list to complete the Challenge. These children will <u>automatically</u> complete the Challenge, due to classroom and specialist teachers reading to them throughout the year. However, if you want to encourage your child to read as a family or on their own, parents can help log their books online for additional prizes.
- Students in Years 3 6 must read 20 books from the PRC list independently, log their books online and print out their reading log to hand in. I will be teaching Year 3 students how to do this during their library lessons, and those in Years 4 6 should remember how to do this. If not, just ask!
- All students can read 5 books of their choice (titles not on the PRC book list).
- All students who complete the PRC independently, must print out their reading log and hand
  it into the library before or no later than Friday, August 20<sup>th</sup>, 2021 to receive their prizes at school and
  a certificate from the Premier (which comes in Term 4).
- Prizes for independent completion are an ASPIRE card, a bookmark, your name on a special sticker displayed on the PRC Wall of Fame and a certificate signed by the Premier. There is a special GOLD certificate for those who complete the PRC 4 years in a row, and a PLATINUM certificate for students who complete the Challenge all 7 years of K 6!

# MANLY WEST'S NAR NAR NASTE

WE HAVE EXCITING PLANS AT MANLY WEST TO BECOME A WASTE-FREE SCHOOL!

Lots of initiatives will be rolled out in 2021. Student Waste Warriors are leading the charge but they need your support!

Each week, tips and tricks will be shared in the newsletter to help parents help Manly West be a more sustainable school.

In May 2019, the Manly West waste audit found that 40kg of unsorted waste goes to landfill EVERY DAY.

The students sorted all this rubbish and found that:





56% was organic waste (food and contaminated paper) - which should go in the school compost bins

8% was clean paper - which should go in Manly West's paper recycling bins

9% was soft plastics (chip packets and ziplock bags) - which should go in REDcycle bins at supermarket

16% was hard plastics - which should go in yellow bins

And there were 81 drink containers - which should go to Return & Earn to raise money for the school!

Food waste, canteen bags and Return & Earn containers can be left at school. All other waste, including uneaten food, will be taken home where it can be sorted and disposed of properly.
