A team of staff are currently working on the 2021-2024 Strategic Improvement Plan. Our Vision for students at Manly West is part of that plan.

As part of the situational analysis, it was recognised that a significant school focus should continue on high impact Teacher Professional Learning that links with the Strategic Plan, the Excellence Framework and the 2019 Alice Springs Declaration to support the Manly West PS student centred Vision and enhance and refine teacher and student confidence.

We will continue to focus on strong foundations and high expectations to increase the number of students achieving in the top two bands of Literacy and Numeracy.

General Capabilities and Visible Learning practices including feedback, setting goals, curriculum differentiation, and formative and summative assessment practices were implemented in the last school plan. Student Attendance

Regular attendance at school is important so that students can achieve their educational best. We thank parents for their efforts to ensure students are at school on time, ready to learn.

The Department of Education acknowledges that on occasion students may be absent. Student absences may include:

- being sick or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral.

Parents must provide an explanation for absences to the school within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence. Where an explanation has not been received within the 7-day timeframe, the school will record the absence as unjustified on the student's record.

Practice NAPLAN Tests

Next week, Years 3 and 5 students will participate in a practice online NAPLAN test. Regional Swimming Carnival Report

On Monday 15th March, four Manly West students (Hugo, Collins 2L, Leo Kozlinski 3T, Isabel Wimpole 3J and Phoenix Berbakov 4J) attended the Regional Swimming Carnival at the Sydney Olympic Park Aquatic Centre. Reports from the students' parents have stated it was an excellent carnival and that the Manly West children represented their zone tremendously well. The results for each student are stated below.

- Hugo Collins (Boys 8Yrs 50m Freestyle): Finished 30th Overall in his age group
- Leo Kozlinski (Boys 8Yrs 50m Freestyle): Finished 10th Overall in his age group
- Isabel Wimpole (Girls 9Yrs 50m Freestyle): Finished 13th Overall in her age group
- Phoenix Berbakov (Boys 8-10Yrs 50m Breaststroke): Finished 2nd in his heat and a top half finish in the final.

These students are to be commended on their outstanding efforts at the Regional Carnival this year. Also, thank you to the parents/caregivers who were able to take them to the carnival on the day.

Typing program

All students in Years 1-6 now have access to a typing program called Typing Tournament online. Your child has a log in that allows them to access interactive games that build their touch typing skills. Some grades have included this program in their homework and your child is free to use the program at home.

Year 5 Quarantine Excursion Report

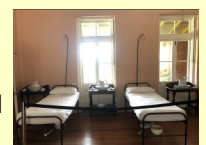
First we met our tour guide, Martin. He told us about the history of Sydney Cove and about the Q Station. Martin then took us to the Gravedigger's Cottage and summoned a spirit called Sam. Martin taught us about the devastation that smallpox caused while we had a tour of the hospital where infected people were treated. We also saw the shower rooms where immigrants were ordered to wash.

Our tour guide talked about first contact in Sydney Harbour. We went inside the Gravedigger's Cottage and also saw the mortuary where autopsies were done. In the hospital, our tour guide showed us pictures of doctors and nurses and people infected with smallpox, as well as an old-fashioned scale used to weigh babies.

After that, we saw the rooms where the luggage of immigrants was deep-cleaned. We also toured the shower rooms and the laundry room, which they now use to educate visitors about the history of the Quarantine Station.

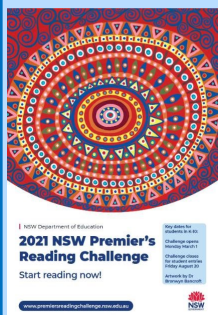
Volunteer to help

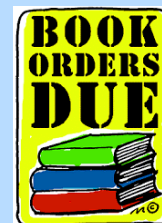
Library News

MANLY WEST'S WAR ON WASTE

BETTER WRAPPING

The best option is to have NO wrapping or packaging at all. Use small containers or a 'bento' lunchbox to keep everything separated.

Beeswax wraps are natural and endlessly reusable. They are easy to make – see the recipe below!

Aluminium foil should be washed and reused. Ask your children to always bring it home. Once it is too scrappy to use, roll it into a fist-sized ball and pop in the yellow bin. It's a valuable resource.

Brown paper bags can be composted if soiled with food but should be recycled or reused if clean.

Ziplock bags are handy but should never be single-use. They can be washed and reused dozens of times.

Cling film or Glad Wrap CANNOT be recycled and should be avoided.

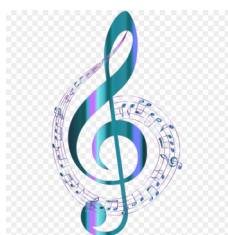
