Welcome back everyone. At the end of last term, we finished the Annual School Report 2020 and the 2021-2024 Strategic Improvement Plan. External Validation/ School Excellence Framework

Every five years, the School Executive Team is expected to assess the school standards against the School Excellence Framework which covers Teaching, Learning and Leading domains with 14 elements. A panel from the Department of Education will then visit and make an overall decision with MW school leaders of our progress and future directions. Term Two Uniform Change

In the first two weeks of Term 2, students may wear either summer or winter uniform as the weather dictates. In Week 3, beginning Monday 3rd May, we request that all students wear winter uniform.

Learning and Support

Each term, teachers are involved in a Data Checkpoint to discuss student growth and attainment in Literacy and Numeracy, specifically Reading, Writing and Mathematics. Following this, allocation of resources to support student learning is determined at the Learning and Support Team Data Checkpoint. We adopt an intervention model of Learning and Support so that different cohorts of students are targeted to further support their learning. Support may be individual or part of a small group, in the classroom or through withdrawal lessons and provided by various staff including Learning and Support Teachers, Student Learning Support Officers (SLSOs) and executive staff. Mrs Jill Robertson also organises and monitors the Reading Tutor program supported by community volunteers, who are often retired teachers. Parents and carers of will be notified by a letter sent home if your child is included in one of the .

Assembly



Kindergarten are starting grade assemblies this term. They will meet as a grade on a Friday.

Year 1 and 2 will continue weekly assemblies on Friday at 12:30. Parents and carers of students who are receiving a banner are welcome to attend as are parents and carers of Year 2 students hosting the assembly.

School Attendance

If a student misses as little as eight days in a school term, by the end of primary school they'll have missed over a year of school.

Missing school means your child misses out on vital educational information and maintaining learning routines. This can result in a loss of confidence and missing out on forming vital friendships.

Attendance is recorded each day. As a parent or caregiver, you are responsible for ensuring your child attends school every day, including sports days unless your child:

- has an unavoidable medical or dental appointment (preferably these should be made after school or during holidays)
- is required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- is required to attend an exceptional or urgent family circumstance (such as attending a funeral)
- is sick, or has an infectious illness.

If you are having difficulty getting your child to attend school regularly please talk to your child's teacher. If your child has to be absent from school for any reason, including arriving late or leaving early, please either tell your child's teacher or an administration officer at our school, or explain the reason by using the MWhatsApp, phone, email, or written note as soon as possible and within seven days.

Year 4 Numeracy and Reading 'Check-in Assessment'

Over the next two weeks, Year 4 will be completing an online Numeracy and Reading 'Check-in Assessment'. These assessments are developed by the NSW Department of Education and provide detailed information on student learning progress to teachers in order to support differentiation and teaching in the classrooms.

Years 3 and 5 Online NAPLAN

NAPLAN online assessments will be completed by Years 3 and 5 between 11th and 18th of May. A practice test was completed by all students last term and we are continuing to support student readiness in class. This will be the first time Manly West students have completed Online NAPLAN.

Tell Them From Me Survey

We have a busy term ahead, starting with the Tell Them From Me survey this week. Students in Years 4, 5 and 6 will be completing a short online survey that provides us with their perspective on a range of aspects of school life, practices and procedures, and assists us to capture student voice. The school will use this data to identify and make broad improvements to student engagement, wellbeing and teaching practices. This survey is repeated in Term 4 and teachers and parents are also invited to complete a survey later in the year.

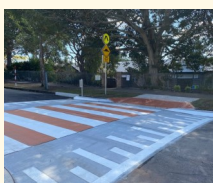


SCHOOL ZONE SAFETY AND KISS AND DROP ZONES
