From the Deputy's Desk

Interpreting Your Child's School Report-17th June

Student progress is assessed continuously throughout the school year through a range of strategies which include teacher observation, checklists, tests, peer assessments, self-assessments, projects, practical work samples and performance items. Written reports are provided towards the conclusion of Terms 2 and 4. Tomorrow you will receive your child's Semester One report.

A scale is used to judge student **effort**;

Outstanding, High, Sound, Inconsistent and Limited.

Effort is highly valued by the school and is reflected in our School Expectation to ASPIRE. We encourage you to celebrate your child's learning by making time to discuss the progress report with your child and congratulate their efforts. We aim to develop lifelong learners who reflect on their progress and develop a positive growth mindset.

Teachers have assessed each student's **achievement** compared with the expectations described in each Key Learning Area (KLA) syllabus.

<u>Kindergarten</u> students' progress will be reported through a checklist of skills in Literacy and Numeracy using a 4 point scale, using the word descriptors:

Beyond Grade Expectations, Achieved, Developing and Beginning.

Beyond Grade Expectations

The student is achieving skills and concepts beyond the expectations of Early Stage One.

Achieved

The student has successfully achieved the skills and concepts relevant to Early Stage One.

Developing

The student is working towards the achievement of the skills and concepts relevant to Early Stage One.

Beginning

The student is beginning to display an understanding of the skills and concepts relevant to Early Stage One.

<u>In Years 1-6</u>, judgements are made on a 5 point achievement scale, using the word descriptors; Outstanding, High, Sound, Basic and Limited.

Outstanding

The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.

High

The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and the skills to most situations.

Sound

The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.

Basic

The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a limited level of competence in the processes and skills.

Limited

The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.

Please also note:

- there is no pass, fail or bell curve and there is no set number or spread of grades a teacher or school can allocate.
- a student who receives 'sound' is 'on track' and is achieving grade outcomes.
- an 'achieved' rank on a Kindergarten report relating to Literacy and Numeracy checklist items, equates to a 'sound' on a Year 1 - 6 report.
- reports reflect a snap shot in time. Direct comparisons to a previous year are not encouraged students
 may find aspects of learning more challenging as the content and tasks become more difficult. This does
 not equate to lack of progress but moving through a new stage of learning that may require a different set
 of skills or timeframe to reach competence.

Club 5/6 has been partnering up with the 3&4 educators, brainstorming ideas, some of which have been the delicious special afternoon teas over the past couple of weeks.


