#### **COVID-19 Updates**

In order to minimise disruptions caused to schools by COVID-19 cases, and to maximise the time our students have learning in the classrooms, a number of changes to operations for schools will be introduced from Monday 29 November for the remainder of Term 4.

Rapid antigen 'test-to-stay' program
A rapid antigen home testing (RAHT) 'test-to-stay' program will be available to any student who is a close contact of a COVID-19 case in a school setting. This will enable them to get back to school immediately following a negative PCR test and on the basis they do daily RAHTs before attending school across seven consecutive days. This means that our students' learning is able to continue with minimal interruptions following a positive COVID-19 case. Full support will be available to help implement this should it be required at our school. Many other schools and students are already using RAHTs successfully.



#### Singing, chanting and instruments that rely on breath allowed outdoors



In line with community settings, instruments that rely on breath and singing and chanting will now be permitted if held outdoors, within cohorts, with distancing in place and where there is no sharing of instruments. Under these same conditions, music classes, bands, ensembles, group repetition and choirs can also resume.

### **EMERGENCY WEEK AT BASC**

The Kindy and Year 1 children were absolute superstars during Emergency Week! They excelled at our practice drills, showing how calm and sensible they can be during serious situations. To "celebrate" the week (believe me, it's an exciting week in BASC's calendar) we painted a mural, played some emergency games, and did a pop quiz. I was so impressed by the children's knowledge of all things Emergency Week!



Emergency week was a huge success down in the Year 2 room!!! We were super proud of how the children conducted themselves in both the evacuations and lockdowns. They showed great maturity for their age! Throughout the week we also had some fun emergency week activities programmed. These included Bingo for the chance to name our emergency bear, Emergency week themed trivia as well as many others!!



Years 3 & 4 Room- To start emergency week we created our very own birds-eye view model of the whole of Manly West! Children worked together collaboratively to imagine how to translate a detailed google maps photo into a three-dimensional wooden model. We then used this scene to teach each other our escape routes and assembly points in a group discussion. We also had a drama-based activity, where a group posed as educators complete with their own BASC staff name tags and clipboards - acting both as the children and adults to understand how we perform our lockdowns and evacuations in different emergency scenarios.



The wet weather didn't stop the Year 5% room from carrying out a great Emergency Week!

The children were perfect role models for the younger years and led by example during the evacuation and lockdown practices. During the week we the children joined in on emergency themed Scattegories, Hama Beads and created their own emergency week trivia questions to challenge their friends!


