P&C Thank you-Easter Morning Tea


Thank you to the Manly West Community led by Stephanie O'Donahue and Marina Smith for

Reading Tutors

We are seeking volunteers to support students with reading one to three mornings per week for 25-50 minutes. This is a withdrawal program where tutors work one on one with students for 25 mins. Semester Accounts (Term One and Two)

The term accounts have been sent home through email. The following online programs may be listed on your account and can be accessed at school and from home:

Matific (all students)

This year we changed from Mathletics to Matific to assist engagement and critical thinking in Mathematics. Access is via computer, iPad, iPhone, Android phone or tablet. Students log-in to access practice and fluency activities, challenge their thinking with problem-solving and reasoning questions, and reward their learning with certificates and points.



Soundwaves (Years 1-6)

In lieu of the traditional Look, Cover, Write Check method of reviewing spelling words at home, students can access Soundwaves online. Students in Years 1-6 progress their spelling through a systematic synthetic phonics and word-study program designed to develop reading, spelling and writing skills.



Whushka (K-2 students)

Whushka is an online library that gives students access to thousands of home readers both levelled and decodable. This enables us to supplement and support our school home readers.



Typing (Years 1-6)

Typing tuition for students from 6 years. This course teaches skills for life and can be used on any device. Focus is on ten finger typing skills and mastery through game play.



Sport in School Australia (SISA) - Kindergarten and Years 1-4

Students have been involved in a Social Skills program provided by SISA incorporating a wide range of team building and co-operative learning activities. The Social Behaviour program addresses the following key skills -

- · Sharing
- · Co-operation
- · Trust
- Adaptability
- · Visual communication
- · Verbal communication and Problem solving



Yesterday was the last SISA lesson this year for students in Grades 1-4. The Kindergarten program runs throughout the year on Tuesday afternoons from 2:15 -3:15pm and extends to include fundamental movement skills, gymnastics and game skills.

NAPLAN

All of Year 3 and 5 have participated in a practice online NAPLAN assessment. It has been a valuable opportunity for them to experience all the different skills required to navigate the online platform. Students are required to click and drag, use an online ruler tool, listen to words to type the correct spelling, find answers in drop down menus and use tools in the platform such as flagging a question and tracking their progress. 



Students must enter their own poem or story at



STEP 1

STEP 2

in the 'order and download' box. This will take you to your school's secure online ordering site.



STEP 3

Click on 'Order Photos' and complete your details and procedures. During this process you can place orders for additional children at your school and sibling photos, if available







cash/envelope ordering

Your school prefers orders to be placed online. However, if you are unable to order online, please complete your order using the order envelope provided.

STEP 1

Complete a separate order envelope for each individual child's package/s ordered. If ordering for more than one child, payment should be enclosed in the envelope of the eldest child and this should be indicated on the envelope of the other child/children (the envelope that does not have cash enclosed).

STEP 2

Enclose exact cash payment in one envelope for the package/s you are ordering. Payment for more than one child should be in the eldest child's envelope and marked at the bottom of the envelope in the space provided.

STEP 3

Return your completed envelope/s, with correct cash payment, to our photographers on the day.

Please note: You must enclose exact correct payment, as change is not available. Credit card payments can only be made online and we no longer accept cheques. There is a separate envelope for sibling photo orders, should your school choose to offer sibling photos.

School photographs will be returned to your school 4-6 weeks after the day of photography

IMPORTANT - "not for publication" students

If you have instructed your school that your child's image is "not for publication" (sometimes called "do not publish" or "not for media release" instructions), the school will ensure that your child is not presented to our photographers on photo day and school photographs will not be available for purchase. If you wish to change your instruction, then you must notify your school, so they change their records and identify your child as able to be photographed for school photography purposes. All students presented to our photographers by your school on photo day will be photographed, their images will appear in school photography packages with their fellow students and these packages will be available to purchase by all families.

Why not take up the challenge of a Waste-free Easter? When shopping for Easter chocolate, avoid eggs and gift packs packaged in unnecessary plastic boxes. There are plenty of delicious options which only have foil wrapping and no plastic. And remember that foil can be recycled in the yellow bin if collected and scrunched up into a tennis ball-sized lump.

Lunchbox Rescue

Exciting news! Manly West has teamed up with ReCollect, a local company that will pick up Return&Earn containers (those marked with the 10c symbol) from your doorstep and send the money directly to the P&C to fund school sustainability initiatives. WE HAVE EXCITING PLANS AT MANLY WEST TO BECOME A WASTE-FREE SCHOOL!

Lots of initiatives were rolled out in 2021 and the projects are now back on track after the restrictions. Student Waste Warriors are leading the charge but they need your support!

Each week, tips and tricks will be shared in the newsletter to help parents help Manly West be a more sustainable school.

CONTAINER RECYCLING

The 2019 waste audit counted 81 eligible containers in just ONE day. These bottles and cartons are worth 10c each under NSW container deposit scheme!

- \$8 in one day
- \$40 in one week
- \$400 in one term
- \$1600 in one year!!

\$1600 would fund eco initiatives such as recycling bins, water tanks or solar panels.



WASTE-FREE WEDNESDAYS
ARE BACK. EACH WEEK
STUDENTS ARE ASKED TO
BRING A ZERO-WASTE LUNCH
AND THE RED BINS GO 'ON
HOLIDAY'.

Benefits include:

- Encouraging healthier foods
- Creating sustainable habits
- Reducing litter around the school
- Cutting waste disposal costs

Food waste, canteen bags and Return & Earn containers can be left at school. All other waste, including uneaten food, will be taken home where it can be sorted and disposed of properly.

NOW is great time to start thinking about what goes into your child's lunchbox and consider healthy, wastefree alternatives.

All juice cartons, aluminium cans, plastic bottles and glass drink containers can be recycled for cash if they have the 10c symbol. (Wine bottles and large milk containers are not included yet)

Manly West has partnered with ReCollect to collect containers from your doorstep. So easy! The money raised will go straight to sustainability initiatives at the school. The Manly West 'bottle drive' will be in Term 2, dates will be announced soon.

Alternatively, find Return & Earn reverse vending machines at Coles Manly Vale (in the carpark) and Woolworths Balgowlah (in the underground carpark).


