We hope that you had an enjoyable holiday and that your children are ready for a busy Term 3 ahead.

Our Manly West Vision states that all students reach their full potential to succeed academically and thrive as healthy, active, critical and creative thinkers and local and global life-long learners who connect and contribute to their school community and society.

Assessment Capable Students

Students will continue to develop skills to become Assessment Capable through active engagement with Learning Intentions and Success Criteria across a widening range of subjects. Criteria is measured using the Novice to Master Framework, incorporating traditional A-E grading and SOLO Taxonomy, which highlights the difference between surface and deep understanding. Students and teachers use the **Novice to Master** rubrics to assess where students are at and their next steps in learning. One key element that we will focus on this term in Writing is editing and feedback. **Please see the rubric criteria and further explanation on the last page.**

Arrival and dismissal

Every morning, Year 4 will continue to line up under the COLA outside the Hall. Please could they place their bags in their lines outside the hall. They are not to enter their classrooms until school starts.

Centenary Production — History of Manly West

Throughout Semester One, and continuing this term, students will be rehearsing their dance for our Manly West Production that will be held in Week 9. This is a long standing tradition at Manly West and returns this year after recent years living with restrictions. As part of the Production, each class performs a dance that has been taught in Amber Krilet-ich's Dance program. The dance will be performed in at least one afternoon and evening session during the week of 12th September. Further information about your child's costume will be provided shortly along with allocated times of performances.

Education Week — Centenary Activities

As part of our Centennial Education Week, we will have an Open Day on Wednesday morning 17th August. Parents and caregivers are invited into their child's classroom for a session to observe their learning and participate in our school 100 year anniversary activities. Students will be involved in various Olden Day games to celebrate our school's Centenary years and can dress up in 1920s attire.

Mathematics

During Numeracy lessons, students will be participating in differentiated activities which develop their skills in the strands of Number and Algebra, Measurement and Geometry and Statistics and Probability. Our teachers have worked collaboratively to program a variety of activities based on the NSW Mathematics syllabus where mathematical strategies have been sequenced over the course of the year. Teachers will be guiding students to think critically and creatively within set tasks and scaffold their ability to explain their thinking and how they achieved an answer. This term, we will be specifically focusing on Multiplication and Division mental and written strategies and we will also be covering the topics of Length, 2D Shapes and 3D Objects.

English

During Literacy, students will be participating in speaking and listening activities, reading and comprehension, as well as a variety of writing activities which are based on the NSW English syllabus. In Writing, students will be focusing on writing persuasive texts for an intended audience. Students will continue to participate in Focus on Reading lessons where they will work on the Super Six Reading Strategies which will include Summarising and they will also take part in Literacy Group Rotations where they will be focusing on Fluency and Vocabulary and applying the Super Six strategies when reading and comprehending texts. Spelling will be taught within writing and we will continue our Soundwaves program.

<u>History</u>

During this semester, we will explore the topic 'First Contacts.' This topic introduces world history and the movements of peoples. Beginning with the history of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, students examine European exploration and colonisation in Australia and throughout the world up to the early 1800s. Students study the impact of exploration on other societies, how these societies interacted with newcomers, and how these experiences contributed to their cultural diversity.

Science and Technology

This Semester Year 4 will be returning to the Kitchen Garden for gardening and sustainability lessons as well as integrated science lessons. Students will engage in a unit called 'Feathers, Fur and Leaves' which involves identifying and classifying living things. Year 4 will also have the opportunity to care for our Manly West chickens. Please contact Danielle Farmer (our parent coordinator) via the school office if you are available to assist caring for the chickens on weekends as she is kindly putting a roster together. Please ensure your child has a hat to wear during Kitchen Garden classes.

There will be a homework grid which needs to be checked and signed by parents each week. There will also be a spelling activity which needs to be completed in the Homework book. Homework will also continue to be posted on Google Classroom. We still encourage students to read daily for at least 20 minutes and complete their reading logs.
