Dear Parent/Caregiver,

Welcome back to Term Three. We hope you have enjoyed the school holidays and are looking forward to a busy term ahead.

Year Two classes will continue to program collaboratively across all Key Learning Areas. This newsletter will provide you with an overview of what the children will be learning in class and the exciting events they have to look forward to this term.

Our Manly West Vision states that all students reach their full potential to succeed academically and thrive as healthy, active, critical and creative thinkers and local and global life-long learners who connect and contribute to their school community and society.

Assessment Capable Students

Students will continue to develop skills to become Assessment Capable Students through active engagement with Learning Intentions and Success Criteria across a widening range of subjects. Criteria is measured using the **Novice to Master Framework**, incorporating traditional A-E grading and SOLO Taxonomy. This highlights the difference between surface and deep understanding. Students and teachers use the **Novice to Master** rubrics to assess where students are at and their next steps in learning. One key element that we will focus on this term in Writing is editing and feedback. **Please see the rubric criteria and further explanation on the last page**.

Centenary Production- History of Manly West

Throughout Semester One, and continuing this term, students will be rehearsing their dance for our Manly West Production held in Week 9. This is a long standing tradition at Manly West and returns this year after recent years living with restrictions. As part of the Production, each class performs a dance that has been taught in Amber Kriletich's Dance program. The dance will be performed in at least one afternoon and evening session during the week of 12th September. Mathematics

Students will participate in differentiated lessons which develop their skills in Number and Algebra, Measurement and Geometry, Statistics and Probability. Activities will be a variety of hands-on and written activities to achieve outcomes in our Mathematics syllabus. We are focusing on building the capacity of students to reason, problem solve and explain their thinking mathematically.

Geography

Throughout Terms 3 and 4, students will be focusing on Australia, its location on a world map, States and Territories within Australia and how we are connected to places in Australia. Students will explore case studies of significant places in Australia They will look at Indigenous perspectives and how Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people are connected to the land and sea.

Science and Technology

This term, Year 2 will develop their skills in representing and explaining their understanding of water and how it is collected, transported and accessed in the unit 'Water World'. Students will be provided with opportunities to conduct experiments in how water is managed and how we use it at home and in our environment. Students will continue to visit the PC lab weekly.

Creative and Practical Arts

During Visual Arts, Year 2 will make artworks representing both real and imagined situations exploring a range of techniques and media. We will discuss qualities of artworks such as subject matter and technique, recognising that artists create artworks for different audience. Within Drama, students will explore and convey stories, events and feelings through roles and they work collaboratively to communicate and express feelings about the action of the drama. Students will experience and respond to a range of drama forms and elements by making, performing and appreciating different aspects. Music will be taught by either Mrs Heather Menzies or Mrs Beth Dowdle.

PD/Health/PE

This term, all classes will be participating in a skill development sports program to build gross motor and team sportsmanship. Students will need to wear sports uniforms on <u>Mondays and Tuesdays</u>.

We will start Child Protection lessons that focus on teaching student's strategies to keep their bodies safe. Please contact your child's teacher if you have any further queries.

I can think of many ideas and start to provide examples. I have sound and evolving knowledge, and understanding of what is being learnt through the use and experimentation of scaffolds and models. I have sound competence in the processes and skills needed to achieve this outcome.

Exper

I can give examples and make connections between different ideas, seeing the bigger picture. I can explain the importance and significance of what is being learnt. I have expanding and high amounts of knowledge and a deep understanding of what is being learnt and am demonstrating some independence. I have high levels of competence in the processes and skills needed to achieve this outcome.

Master

I can see how these ideas connect to other things I know about. This learning is erupting into other areas of my life enabling me to impact positively on others. I have extensive knowledge and an outstanding understanding of what is being learnt. I am independent in this learning and can teach others. I have a sophisticated and outstanding level of competence in the processes and skills needed to achieve this outcome.
