#### **Assessment Capable Students**

As a K-6 school, we are focusing on students participating actively in their own learning using a Visible Learning Approach. Teachers use Learning Intentions and Success Criteria to make it clear to students what is the expected learning to be achieved in lessons for all abilities. We are building student capacity so that students know what they are learning, why and how they can improve and move to the next level in learning. If students know this, they can assess their own learning with teacher feedback and reach their full potential in each lesson.

## **New English and Mathematics Curriculum**

In 2024, English and Mathematics syllabus documents are being implemented in Year 3-6.

K-2 English and Mathematics Syllabus documents were implemented in 2023 and are now being embedded in 2024. Teachers will continue to engage in professional learning to build their capacity to deliver the pedagogy embedded in these documents to achieve set outcomes. #### Stage 3 Key Learning Areas

## **English**

In English, students will explore how a significant historical event can be portrayed through different genres. Students will engage with various texts that describe the Wave Hill Walk-Off under the leadership of Vincent Lingiari, and consider the context and perspective of each of the authors.

#### Mathematics

The focus areas for Mathematics will include: Representing Numbers, Multiplicative Relations, Data, Geometric Measure (Coordinates and Length). Working Mathematically will be embedded throughout the term which develops students' understanding and fluency in mathematics through exploring and connecting mathematical concepts, choosing and applying mathematical techniques to solve problems, and communicating their thinking and reasoning coherently and clearly.

## Geography

Year 6 will be studying the topic, 'A Diverse and Connected World' where students will be learning how to apply geographical tools, mapping skills, and grid references which links to Mathematics outcomes. Students will be investigating the features and characteristics of countries in Asia and the connections between people and environments.

#### **PDHPE**

As part of the Personal Development syllabus, students will continue to develop intrapersonal and interpersonal understanding and skills through the Smiling Mind program. They will also participate in the Healthy Harold program where they will cover the topic, 'Take a Breath' the focus will be on healthy living and the negative impacts of smoking and vaping. We will continue to support students throughout the year and continually monitor their welfare.

PSSA and School Sport will operate each Friday, giving students the opportunity to develop physical and sportsmanship/teamwork skills. Weekly Dance lessons with Mrs Amber Kriletich further provide students with a creative opportunity to develop their fitness and agility. Students will participate in a Production at the end of this semester. Please note the format of the Production will be different from previous years to cater for our growing school. Students must wear sports uniforms on Wednesdays and Fridays.

## Music, Science and Technology:

Year 6 will participate in weekly Music lessons with Ms MacOurt and weekly Science lessons with Mrs Bellomo for Semester 1. In Music, students are connecting music to its time, place and purpose, and exploring the impact of this on its sound. They will explore issues of the last century and music that impacted, and responded to, social change. Students will be singing, playing a variety of instruments and responding to music from a variety of contexts.

In Term 1, Year 6 students will be exploring the topic of 'Forces'. They will investigate common contact and non-contact forces such as applied force, gravity, air resistance, elastic force and buoyancy. Students will employ the scientific method when conducting investigations and utilise the concept of 'fair' testing. Students will continue to develop technology skills using a range of GSuite for Education apps and increase their typing speed and accuracy using the Typing Tournament online program.

## **Leadership Development:**

There are multiple leadership opportunities available for students this year, which we have been communicating to students. We are also currently electing and training students to be SRC Representatives, Multicultural Officers, Flag Monitors, Technology Team and PBEL Monitors where they support the implementation of the school expectations in the classroom and playground and may also have some responsibilities in assemblies. All Year 6 students will also be participating in an incursion called 'Aspire Higher' on the 30<sup>th</sup> April where they will participate in 3 leadership sessions which will develop their skills and strengths. All students will also participate in our Buddy Program with Kindergarten Students.

### Homework:

Homework begins in Week 4. All homework will be posted on Google Classroom. This will consist of (reading log, and spelling activities) and some online (research assignments and presentations and Matific Mathematics). We expect students to keep up to date with homework requirements as they transition into high school.
